BOATING REGULATIONS SUMARY

To avoid scouters being put in the embarassing position of having to say 'no' to a request to use boats outside Scout Meetings, general boating regulations are summarised below. The regulations are not just to cover safety, failure to comply renders our insurance nul and void, or could lead to prosecution.

- Leanders boats are all subject to annual inspection for seaworthiness and registration/insurance purposes. Use of any boat for Scouting activities is subject to the boat being registered with the Scout Association or, alternatively, its use being first approved by the Group Scout Leader.
- Leander Boats have Thames Water Authority 'exemption plates' -i.e. special licences issued at significantly reduced licence fees. Use is restricted to Scouts/Sea Rangers or Instructors.
- 3) Only the two wooden gigs are licenced for use by non scouts, e.g. Guild, Leander Supporters/Social Club members.
- 4) The safety boat is the ONLY boat registered for use on the Thames with an outboard motor. <u>Cutboards must not be used on any other boat above</u> <u>Teddington Lock</u>. N.B. The Safety boat also carries an 'exemption plate' and may only be used by a person holding an appropriate charge certificate.
- 5) Life jackets must be worn when sailing, a bouyancy aid or life Jacket worn when canoeing or windsurfing.
- 6) Life Jackets must be carried in pulling boats when on tidal waters and worn if the person in charge considers it necessary due to water or weather conditions
- 7) Non-swimmers must wear a life jacket at all times or until they have passed the 50 yard swimming test.
- 8) Persons in charge of Group boats must hold an appropriate Scout Association charge certificate, or be under the supervision of a qualified/authorised Leader.(N.B. Although some boys have passed charge certificates, for insurance purposes, until 18 years old, they can still only take command with the specific authority of the Leader supervising. Similarly, use of the wooden gigs by Adults/non Scouts must be approved by the G.S.L. who must be satisfied that the person in command is competent.
